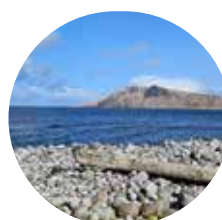

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

Aang Unanga Shareholders & Descendants,

Summer provides important opportunities to connect with shareholders and families across our communities. It was a pleasure to see so many of you at this year’s picnic. The conversations we share—and the responsibility we carry on behalf of our shareholders—continue to shape how we lead Aleut with discipline, accountability, and a focus on long-term value creation.

This spring, Aleut announced its 2026 Annual Distribution of \$10 per share and a \$1,000 Elder Benefit, reinforcing our commitment to providing consistent and reliable value to shareholders. Distributions will be issued through the Settlement Trust in July and will be tax-free to shareholders.

Distributions are one important way Aleut shares the success of the Corporation with shareholders and their families, and we have a responsibility to ensure they remain sustainable over the long term. Our disciplined approach balances shareholder distributions with reinvestment in our subsidiaries to strengthen performance, manage risk, and support the Corporation’s continued growth.

This summer, we are excited to host Shareholder Informational Meetings across our region. These gatherings strengthen our partnerships and help guide how we serve shareholders today and into the future. Our full travel schedule is available on page 7.

Looking ahead, our 54th Annual Meeting of Shareholders is on Saturday, October 17, in Bellevue, Washington. Every three years, we hold the Annual Meeting in the Seattle area to increase access and engagement to the Corporation for shareholders who live in this area, which is over 25%. A livestream option will also be available. Additional details can be found on page 6.

Recent federal commitments and private-sector agreements have brought increased national attention to Adak and our region. Located 1,100 miles closer to Asia than Hawaii, Adak holds growing strategic importance to Arctic security, national defense, and global connectivity.

As interest and investment continue to grow, Aleut remains focused on opportunities that support both national priorities and meaningful community benefits. We look forward to sharing more as plans continue to develop.

Everything we do is guided by long-term sustainability: building a strong Corporation, honoring our responsibilities to shareholders, and creating opportunities that will endure for future generations.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, thank you to everyone who joined us at this year's Aleut Picnic. These moments remind us that our work is rooted not only in corporate responsibility, but also in the people, relationships, and traditions that define Aleut.

The Board remains focused on ensuring Aleut is well-positioned for the future. A key part of that work is improving the ways shareholders stay informed, connected, and engaged. FROSTY FUELS FBO GRAND OPENING

facility during the Silver Salmon Derby, taking place Friday, September 4 through Sunday, September 6 in Cold Bay, Alaska. We're excited to be in-region for the weekend—both to mark this milestone and to support one of Cold Bay's most important community events. Guests can stop by the FBO anytime throughout the weekend to enjoy food, games, giveaways, and a special Shop Aleut merchandise release, and to enter our grand giveaway, with winners announced at the close of the Derby.

Beyond aviation services, the FBO represents a long-term commitment to strengthening in-region services and supporting the resilience of our region. As Frosty Fuels continues to improve the available in-region services for

crews and operators, the FBO is helping make Cold Bay a more reliable stop for regional and international carriers, building resilient infrastructure that serves communities, supports economic activity, and enhances regional reliability year-round.

This new FBO—developed as part of Aleut Ventures' \$1.25 million investment in Cold Bay through Frosty Fuels services and infrastructure—features a crew lounge and passenger waiting area. It enhances the community's ability to support commercial, cargo, medevac, and local air traffic, while reinforcing Cold Bay's role as a critical hub along North Pacific aviation routes.

We are proud to celebrate this opening alongside the Cold Bay community and look forward to continued investments that serve both near-term service needs and long-term regional growth.

ROOTED IN OUR REGION

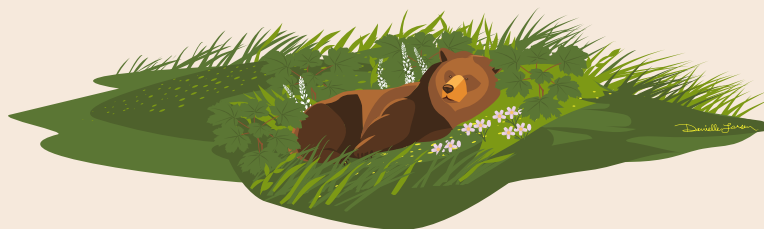
Aleut is proud to announce Danielle Larsen as our 2026 Featured Artist!

Danielle Larsen is a multi-disciplinary artist based in Anchorage, Alaska. Her father, John E. Larsen Jr., was from King Cove, Alaska, and her mother, Florence Wiehl, is from Beaver, Alaska. She is known for large-scale paintings of jarred smoked salmon that pay homage to her father and rich Unangan heritage. With more than a decade in the industry, Danielle is not just an illustrator and painter; she is a visionary storyteller who brings custom designs to life with a splash of color and a dash of innovation. Her art is inspired by the dynamic aspects of contemporary life and the way we exist in this world. Through her creative expression, she fosters a sense of connection and understanding among cultures and communities.

Born and raised in Anchorage, Danielle earned her Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Alaska Native Art and Painting from the University of Alaska Anchorage. Guided by her family and Elders, Danielle grew up learning the art of drawing, beading, and seal gut sewing — traditions passed down with care, carrying the stories and values of her culture.

Danielle has created two beautiful designs for Aleut that highlight the plants in our region, fishing, and brown bears.

With additional designs in process, we are beyond excited to see what designs she created for Aleut with our heritage and region in mind.

RECLAIMING THE WHITE SEAL: A UNANGAN STORY RETOLD



Aleut is proud to partner with and support St. Paul Island residents Garrett Iğayuġ Pletnikoff and Hannah Atsaq Zimmerman as they lead a community education and outreach initiative through Tukuuludaa Creations, reclaiming Rudyard Kipling’s “The White Seal,” the only Jungle Book story set outside India.

Rather than abandoning the story, this project retells it from a modern Unangan and Unangan fishermen’s perspective. In the new interpretation, the seal and the Unangan hunter are allies, united in protecting their shared homeland from destructive fishing practices.

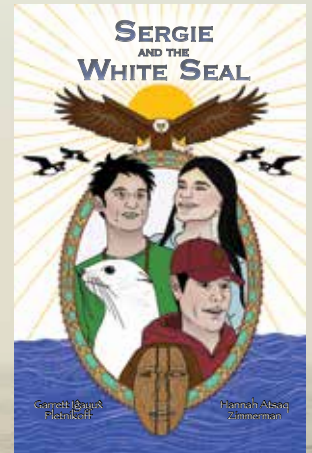
The project includes one of the world’s first middle gradelyoung adult Unangan themed novels (ages 8+), a full cast audiobook, the first majority Unangaġ/Aleut cast production of its kind, and a corresponding art installation featuring soft sculptures made from local St. Paul Island materials using traditional methods. Sámi artists Rebecca Tornberg and Mickael Berglund will illustrate the book and adapt it into a short, animated film. Together, the works will premiere at the 2026 Arctic Arts Summit in Umeå, Sweden, highlighting Indigenous collaboration across Unangan Tanangin and Sápmi.

Summary

So begins the story of Sergie Oustikoff, an Unangan teenager who can’t wait to leave his small island home; and Kotick, an albino fur seal who can imagine no better place in all the world. The two live separate lives, divided by species and habitat—until one day when an unknown danger arrives on Saint Paul Island, bringing fish shortages that threaten the livelihood of humans and fur seals alike. As Kotick turns to Sergie for help, Sergie grapples with the strange, shamanistic powers that seem to burgeon within him whenever the white seal is near. Along with a host of animal and human companions, the two embark on a quest to save their island that will lead them through the annals of history—and into a world of magic they never imagined.

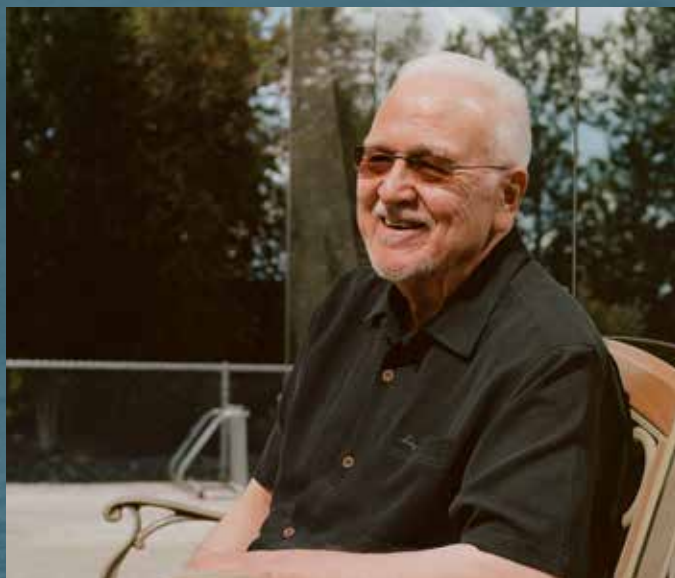

Martha 'Diane' Krukoff (Shane) was born on St. George Island on July 17th, 1952, and passed away at 73 years of age on January 1st, 2026, surrounded by her family. Diane grew up on St. George Island, Alaska [Anġaaxchaluġ] until May '65, then moved to St. Paul Island [Tanaġ-Amiġ], Alaska. After the move, she met the love of her life, the late Agafon Krukoff Jr., in the summer of 1968 on St. Paul Island. Together, they had children, Olga, Sharon, and Jonathan. The family later moved farther into the Aleutians to Adak [Adaax], Alaska, for fifteen years to continue serving the Unangaġ/Aleut community, while she supported her husband, who was the first Mayor of Adak, and together they worked at the local Post Office where Diane was the Postmaster.

Diane was known for her love, humor, and kindness by her entire family and friends. She was an avid bingo player, traveler, comedian, and the one to uphold the stories and language she knew of her heritage (Aleut/Unangan).

Diane wasn't just an amazing mother, wife, and friend; she was also the Kukaġ Mama (grandmother) to William, Ryan, and "Kukaġ Doll" Chloe, as well as great-grandma to two year-old Kayuġ and two-month-old Ember. She dearly loved her grandchildren and helped raise them with all the love a grandmother gives, unconditionally.

She truly cherished family time throughout her life, especially the time she spent with her friends.

Even on her final day on earth, she enjoyed it with all her immediate family and "rang" in the New Year with strawberry ice cream, Sunny D, and music played by her son Jonathan. She was happy and at peace to reunite with the love of her life, Agafon ["Harry"].

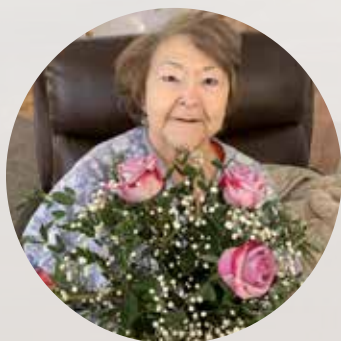

James treasured the friendships he built throughout every stage of life – from kindergarten through adulthood. He had a genuine way of making people feel like family, and his wide circle of friends speaks to the kind of person he was.

Above all, James loved being a father. His son, Elias, was his greatest joy. Their road trips and time spent together created memories that will be cherished forever.
