LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

Aang Aleut Shareholders & Descendants,

Fall marks a natural point to reflect on an active summer and sharpen our focus on the priorities ahead.

Over the summer, the Aleut team visited our regional communities to connect with shareholders, descendants, and partners. Our conversations were candid and highlighted what matters: distributions, investments, and how Aleut is planning for the next generation. The theme for this year's Annual Meeting, At the Table, reflects that same approach: decisions shaped through shared dialogue, grounded in our mission to create measurable, lasting benefits for those we serve.

In July, Aleut returned a clean and timely independent audit with results that verify our fiscal year 2026 record revenue of \$415 million and strong EBITDA of \$32 million. This paves the way for our approach moving into fiscal year 2027, investing in building capacity and long-term outcomes. Aleut's largest capital investment, the Aleut Hangar in Alabama, is in active construction. When complete in early 2027, it will expand aviation capability and position Aleut subsidiaries to compete in markets where scale and technical expertise matter most.

That same focus drives local priorities. In Cold Bay, Aleut Ventures opened a new Fixed Base Operation (FBO), growing our aviation infrastructure to support regional service and delivering tangible benefits for the community.

In Adak, work began on the first phase of the Denali Commission's Arctic Infrastructure Program with a \$5.8 million award. This stage includes planning and design for transportation and fuel systems, supported by critical site assessments and maritime surveys. These actions lay the groundwork for future infrastructure and coordinated development on the island.

In King Cove, Aleut Federal crews are preparing sites to support construction of the road to Cold Bay — a project decades in the making. Residents had the opportunity to participate in workforce development training, including commercial truck driving certifications, creating a direct path for community members to participate in the work that will shape their community.

As these milestones take shape, voting determines what comes next and who will guide the Corporation. Your voice is essential. Proxy packets are arriving in homes with a mail-in ballot and envelope, or you can vote online. It is quick and simple. All shareholders can access the full packet and vote at aleutvote.com.

Aleut's trajectory is deliberate. Every decision from strategic initiatives, investments, and community conversations is aimed at one outcome: strengthening an enterprise that delivers lasting benefit across generations.

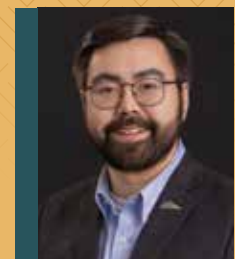

BOARD CHAIR REPORT

Hello Unanga Family,

As fall begins, I look back on a summer of conversations—at meetings, gatherings, and through the questions you’ve shared. Listening matters. It shapes how the Board approaches its responsibilities and the future of your Corporation.

The 54th Annual Meeting of Shareholders will take place in Bellevue, Washington, just outside of Seattle, on October 17, 2026. Over a quarter of our shareholders live in the Pacific Northwest, and every three years we rotate the meeting to offer the opportunity for shareholders to participate where they live. Whether you join us online or in Washington, this is an important opportunity to stay informed and engaged. Complete details and registration can be found on page 8.

Proxy packets are in homes, and voting is open at aleutvote.com. This is one of the most direct ways to influence Aleut’s future. Voting online is simple, and you’ll need your PIN to vote. It can be found on your mailed proxy ballot, emailed to you from noreply@aleutvote.com, or through the PIN lookup tool at aleutvote.com, using the last four digits of your Social Security Number and your date of birth.

This year, nine candidates are on the ballot. The expanded pool provides more choices for our shareholders. As you review the candidate information, consider the responsibilities the role carries: oversight of strategy, focus on financial performance, and representing shareholder voices in planning for long-term resilience and growth. These are positions of trust that require sound judgment and putting the organization’s interests first. More information and candidate profiles are on page 6 and available at aleutvote.com.

When you vote, you will be entered into the proxy prize drawings. Every proxy submitted strengthens shareholder engagement and helps Aleut move forward with clear representation. The early bird deadline is on September 23, with winners announced on September 25. Voting will remain open until October 14.

Your input matters beyond voting. The Shareholder Q&A panel will continue again this year. Submit your questions in advance online—they will be addressed during the meeting, with answers posted after the event and included in the winter newsletter, to keep everyone informed. This format ensures clarity and transparency, and allows us to answer even more of your questions. More information is on page 8.

Thank you for your trust and for being part of this work. Your voice, through voting, dialogue, and ideas, shapes the decisions we make at the table today and for generations ahead.

Aleut Federal secured new opportunities that support long-term shareholder value. This quarter, the company was awarded a \$1.2 million Air National Guard security construction project and a \$14.1 million Department of Energy contract supporting operations across nine locations nationwide.

Aleut Federal is pursuing new business with three Regional Project Management Offices in Southern California, Texas, and the Pacific Northwest, bringing services closer to customers and expanding its reach in key markets.

In addition, Aleut Federal supports the U.S. Space Force's Officer Training Course (OTC), a program that is critical in developing and training the next generation of space operations professionals. Recognition of the program's importance underscores the value of the mission-critical work Aleut Federal helps deliver and reinforces the company's reputation for excellence across its service areas.



A significant milestone this quarter was Strata-G Solutions' award of the Javelin BST Contract, expanding the company's role in supporting critical defense programs. The award adds logistics support and repair services to Strata-G's existing capabilities, allowing the company to provide customers with a broader range of solutions throughout a product's lifecycle.

The contract also creates opportunities for future task orders and long-term follow-on work, helping diversify revenue streams and strengthen Strata-G's position in the defense market.



Aleut Mechanical continued to build momentum through its expansion into the Anchorage market. The company has secured several new Southcentral Alaska projects, including work for the State of Alaska, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium, Association of Village Council Presidents, and Holland America Princess, while also advancing projects such as the Palmer Courthouse Expansion.

The expansion has opened new relationships with customers and industry partners, broadening Aleut Mechanical's reach across commercial and industrial markets. Demand remains strong for heating and plumbing renovations, maintenance services, and emergency repairs, creating a growing pipeline of opportunities.

Reaching these targets ahead of schedule demonstrates strong demand for the company's services and establishes a foothold in one of Alaska's largest commercial construction markets.



A major highlight this quarter was the successful opening of the new Frosty Fuels Fixed Base Operator (FBO) facility in Cold Bay, a strategic investment that strengthens services for aviation operators while reinforcing Cold Bay's role as a critical North Pacific transportation hub. The project reflects Aleut Ventures' continued commitment to investing in regional infrastructure that supports economic activity, connectivity, and future business opportunities.

Aleut Ventures also continued to grow tourism and hospitality offerings in Adak through cruise ship excursions, lodging enhancements, and recreational rentals.

RES WILLOW SOLAR FARM:

Investing in Alaska's Energy Future

The Willow Solar Farm represents an important milestone for Aleut's long-term investment strategy in Alaska's energy sector. Located along the Parks Highway in Willow, the utility-scale solar facility generates renewable electricity that is delivered to the regional power grid through Matanuska Electric Association (MEA), helping support greater energy diversification and resiliency in Southcentral Alaska.

As one of Aleut Energy's first major renewable energy ownership initiatives, the Willow Solar Farm strengthens Aleut's position in Alaska's growing renewable and utility-scale energy markets while creating opportunities for future energy infrastructure investments across the state.

By generating locally produced renewable electricity, the facility helps support a more balanced energy mix while reducing reliance on fuel sources that can be subject to price volatility and supply chain challenges. It also serves as a visible example of how renewable energy can be successfully deployed and operated in Alaska's unique climate conditions.

Each year, the Willow Solar Farm is estimated to offset approximately 1,000 to 1,300 metric tons of carbon dioxide emissions, generate enough electricity to power approximately 150 to 220 Alaska homes, and provide environmental benefits comparable to removing 220 to 280 vehicles from the road.

Beyond energy production, Aleut Energy has hosted educational tours at the site, helping Alaskans learn more about renewable energy technologies and their role in the state's future energy landscape.

As part of Aleut's growing energy portfolio, the Willow Solar Farm demonstrates how strategic investments can create long-term value for shareholders while supporting infrastructure development, energy reliability, and economic opportunity throughout Alaska.



Aleut Real Estate (ARE) is building on its strong foundation with a growing focus on residential real estate and strategic investments designed to generate long-term returns. In June 2026, Aleut was invited to join the groundbreaking of Raspberry Townhomes, a 58-unit build-to-rent housing development in Anchorage. As part of the project, ARE approved a \$1 million equity investment, providing exposure to a growing segment of Alaska's housing market. Designed as a long-term investment, Raspberry Townhomes is expected to generate stable rental income and cash flow over an extended period, helping diversify Aleut's portfolio and create sustainable returns for shareholders for years to come.

Alongside its established property management, brokerage, and commercial real estate services, ARE continues to pursue new investment opportunities and partnerships that diversify revenue streams and strengthen Aleut's portfolio.
